* <u>Declaration of Faith</u>: The Living Faith, Chapter 6 (in unison) We are not always certain that God is with us. At times God calls us to live in this world without experiencing the divine presence, often discerning God's nearness only as we look back.

At other times God seems absent in order that our faith may be tested. Through such struggle we mature in faith. God may also chasten and strengthen us through the hard circumstances of life.

Questioning may be a sign of growth. It may also be disobedience: we must be honest with ourselves.
