northern Taiwan (1871-1901).

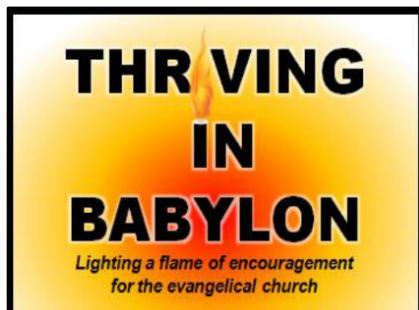
Dedicating his life to providing medical and dental support,
