"What will I be doing as an elder?"

In Session meetings, many voices are heard as elders participate in discussions about congregational matters. However, outside the meetings and for the unity of Session, elders speak with one voice. While the Session may regularly deal with sensitive and confidential matters in its meetings, on other matters it can communicate frequently and clearly with the congregation to keep everyone informed.

Being an elder is a spiritual calling that can be challenging, interesting and fulfilling. Elders use their God-given gifts to serve and strengthen God's Church, helping to lead it forward in its mission to announce the good news to the world.
