“IMAGES OF GOD”

OCTOBER 16 – NOVEMBER 13

What was your earliest idea of God?

An old man on a throne, a fiery pillar, a shepherd, a bright light?

Inspired by the Holy Spirit, the writers of Scripture used poetic language to compare the Lord to many ordinary things on earth.

In our Fall Bible Study we will explore eight of these images of God from scripture. The purpose of our study is to focus on our

relationship to the reality behind the image, rather than simply the word pictures themselves.
