Thanks to all who were able to respond to our Thanksgiving financial appeal. St. Paul's current fund for day-to-day costs is in much better shape than it was two months ago. Through November 13, your current fund donations are \$158,400. The average of the last three years was \$145,200. This is wonderful news. The not-as-good news is that we have still spent about \$12,750 more than we have received. So, thank you, and as you are able, a regular schedule of donations helps to avoid "emergencies".
